



# Strangling Vine Lace

## The Basic Details

### Yarn:

I use a single skein of Handmaiden Seasilk (and I didn't use it all) which had 437 yards to 100 grams (fingering weight).

### Needles and Gauge:

I used US size 4. This is a scarf, so gauge isn't so important. If you think your scarf is turning out too lacey, go down a size. If you want something more open, go up a size.

## The pattern:

CO 45 stitches. Knit 4 rows. Begin working in pattern:

Row 1: Knit 3 sts (the stitch has 3 stitches of garter on each side) for edging. K1, \*yo, k2, ssk, k2tog, k2, yo, k1\* repeat between the \* four times. K2 sts, knit remaining 3 sts (the edge stitches).

Row 2 and 4: K3, purl until last 3 stitches, K3.

Row 3: Knit 3 sts, K2, \*yo, k2, ssk, k2tog, k2, yo, k1\* repeat between the \* four times. K1 st and knit the remaining 3 stitches.

Knit until scarf is desired length. End by knitting 4 rows.
